MARTIN HUNTER,
A PROCLAMATION.
WHEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this Province stands prorogued to the Second Tuesday in DECEMBER next; I have thought fit, by and with the advice of His MAJESTY'S Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the Fourth Tuesday in JANUARY next ensuing, then to meet at Fredericton for the dispatch of business.

GIVEN under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty-eighth day of November in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Nine, and in the Fiftieth year of His Majesty's Reign.

MARTIN HUNTER,
A PROCLAMATION.
BY Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of His MAJESTY'S Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His MAJESTY'S Colonies and Plantations in North-America and in the West-India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His MAJESTY'S said Subjects and the Foreign "Islands in the West-Indies." I do, by and with the advice and consent of His MAJESTY'S Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley, or Grain of any sort, to be imported into this Province by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned and navigated according to Law, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for and during the term of Six Months from this date: And of this Proclamation all Persons whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
