A PROCLAMATION.

Y Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the twenty-eighth year of His MAJESTY's Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between " the Subjects of His MAJESTY's Colonies and Plantati-" ons in North-America and in the West-India Islands, "and the Countries belonging to the United States of "America, and between His MAJESTY's said Subjects "and the Foreign Islands in the West-Indies." I do, by and with the advice and consent of His MAJESTY's Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley or Grain of any sort, to be imported into this Province by Bri-

tish Subjects, in British built Ships, owned and naviga-

ted according to Law, from any of the Territories be-

longing to the United States of America, for and during

the term of Six Months from this date: And of this

Proclamation all Persons whom it may concern will
