By Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to
me in and by an Act of Parliament made and pas-
sed in the twenty-eighth year of His MAJESTY'S Reign,
intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between
the Subjects of His MAJESTY'S Colonies and Plantati-
ons in North-America and in the West-India Islands,
and the Countries belonging to the United States of
America, and between His MAJESTY'S said Subjects
and the Foreign Islands in the West-Indies." I do,
by and with the advice and consent of His MAJESTY'S
Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing
and permitting Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading,
Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any
sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or
Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease,
Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley or Grain
of any sort, to be imported into this Province by Bri-
tish Subjects, in British built Ships, owned and naviga-
ted according to Law, from any of the Territories be-
longing to the United States of America, for and during
the term of Six Months from this date: And of this
Proclamation all Persons whom it may concern will
take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
