Such Deferters, if from the Regular Forces, being ablebodied men, and fit for Service, thall be fent to the Regiments from which they respectively deferted, or be appointed to fuch Regiments in the United Kingdom as His Majefty may be pleafed to command; and when to placed, thall not be liable to be claimed by any other corps to which they may fornierly have belonged ; and if from the Militia, shall be fent to the Regiments to which they respectively belonged, &c. &c. &c. His Majelly has further been pleased to direct, that Deferters now actually in confinement as fuch, shall have the benefit of this his Royal Pardon.
