PROCLAMATION\* FOR PARDONING DESERTERS FROM HIS MAJESTY'S LAND FORCES.

WAR-OFFICE, Office, October 24, 1809 THEREAS it has been most humbly submitted to the KING, whether on the joy ful occasion of His Majesty's entering into the fifueth year of his reign, it might not be defirable to diffing with fo memorable an epoch by an act of grace to all deferters; and his Majesty having gracionfly approved of his free pardon being extended to all fuch deferters from his Land Forces as shall deliver themselves up within two months from the 25th instant, these are publicly to declare his Majefly's benevolent intention; and to direct that all deferters furrendering themselves to the Commanding Officer of any Regiment, or to any of the Superintending Field-Officers of the Recruiting Service, whose Stations are mentioned in the margin hereof; \* to the Commandant of the Army Depot in the Ille of Wight; or, where there is no Military Post, to a Magistrate, shall be pardoned, and they are hereby, pardoned accordingly,

Such Deferters, if from the Regular Forces, being ablebodied men, and fit for Service, shall be fent to the Regiments from which they respectively deserted, or be appointed to such Regiments in the United Kingdom as His Majeffy may be pleased to command; and when so placed, shall not be liable to be claimed by any other corps to which they may formerly have belonged; and if from the Militia, shall be fent to the Regiments to which they respectively belonged, &c. &c. &c.

His Majesly has further been pleased to direct, that De-

ferters now actually in confinement as such, shall have the benefit of this his Royal Pardon.
