Twenty vellels of war, with 600 merchantmen have entered the Baltic, having no other object than to fmuggle and deposit the cargoes of these ships on the continent .---The Danes have captured 50, the cargoes of which are eftimated at 20 millions. The Ruffians have confifcated 80. These vellels fail under falle colours ; they have falle deftinations, and falle French licence; they call themfelves Americans, Spaniards, and Hamburgers; they have even faile certifica'es of origin from French confuls. They flick at nothing; but all this only fucceeds in part; and if, as is reported, Rullia carefully interdicts the entrance of colonial produce, and if French troops occupy Maclenburg, where English merchandize has so good a market, and where the contraband trade is carried on with fuch activity, English commerce will experience by these measures new obflacles.

The Wagram privateer has just been captured by the English in the port of Stratfund,-This circumflance will prove flill more fatal to their commerce. It affords the French the belt reasons for again taking possession of the coafts of that country, and in future the contraband traders will be purfued with more certainty and greater fafety.

Paris, August 22. A telegraphic desparch, transmitted at fix o'clock in the evening of the 13th infl, has announced to the Prince Viceroy, that Gen. Count Menou, Governor of Venice, died there that morning, after an illnels of 16 days.

Imperial Cuftoms. The Decree of the 5th infl. increafing the duties on the Colonial goods therein mentioned, is to be put in force at the moment that it is officially received. The duties are payable without any exception whatever. The regulations formerly eflablished respecting the importation of colonial produce, remain in full force without any change whatever. Constantinople, July 3. The accounts of the fuccess of the Rullians have thrown the inhabitants of this city into the greatest conflernation. It was the lefs expected, as the highest confidence was reposed in the talents of Pehlivan Aga. The Sultan, however, is not dejected; but makes every pollible effort to reinforce the army of the Grand Vifier. New commiffaries have been fent off to procure fresh supplies of provisions for it. The fleet which confist of 16 fail of the line, has received orders to proceed, with all pollible difpatch to take on board the troops that are coming from Alia. Vienna, August 8. We learn by letters from Conflantinople, that the flandard of Mahomet has been raifed there; that the Grand Seignior has declared, that the empire was in danger; that it was the duty of every Mulfulman to take arms in its defence : and that he would put himfelf at the head of his brave and faithful fubjects. The people, on Uns, pledged themselves to shed the last drop of their blood in defence of the ancient glory of the empire. The intelligence was received there, that the Ruffians had raifed the fiege of Warna. Extract of a letter from Odeffa, July 6. We are inclined to think that there will thorily be concluded, between the Ruffians and the Turks, by means of the cellion which this last power will make of the country fituated on the left bank of the Danube. The Porte mult, it fays be convinced that it never can notwithflanding all its efforts, reconquer Moldavia.

The city of Altona being exempt from the toll line, Commissioners have been appointed there to take a specific inventory of all Colonial products, and keep an exact controul of the fame, fo that none of this merchandize can be fent abroad, without fpecial permission of the faid Commissioners.

" All transports of merchandize, not of European origin, taken nearer the frontiers than the above mentioned places, without proper paffports and permits, are, for the firlt time confiicated, and owner, or he who efcorts fuch a transport, mult pay a fine equal to the value of the confilcated goods; for a fecond or third offence, these fines are raised in proportion; but for, the fourth, the goods are not only confifcated, but the mulets doubled; and in cafe the offender be a Burgher, he lofes his freedom. All the above mentioned mulcis to be for the benefit of the informers, or whoever flops the like transports,"

From a New-York paper of October 18. IT LATEST FROM PORTUGAL.

By Capt. Deane, of the thip Traveller, from Lifbon, from whence he failed on the 6th of September, we learn that Almeida furrendered to the French on the 27th Aug. in which the British loft three of their best regiments.

Several transports had arrived at Lisbon from England and Cadiz. Two Scotch regiments, from Cadiz, arrived at Lifbon on the 4th September.

An Auffrian corps was daily expected to reinforce the French army, which confifted of upwards of 100.000 men. The British army confisted of 80,000 men, and between 70 and 80,000 Portuguese. Every thing was tranquil at Lifbon.

Capt. D. further flates, that about 5000 Portuguele troops who were in the garrifon at Almeida, were made prifoners and fent to France. The news of the repeal of the French decrees, had been received at Lifbon. Admiral Berkeley commands the Portuguese floet.

Despatches from Mr. Pinkney, our Minister at London, were received by this arrival, and forwarded to Walhington by vefterday's mail.

The United States floop of war Hornet, had arrived off Falmouth, and Lieut. Spencer had reached London with the Defpatches from our Government.

The brig Tammaahmaah, Capt. Storey, had also arrived at London, in the remarkable palfage of 16 days from New-York.

Accounts from Balque Roads, received in London, flates that 12,000 French troops and 600 deferters are at Ille d'Aix, ready to embark for South America. Three thips of the line were at Charante, and in Aix Roads, three frigates, gun-brigs, &c.

The regency of Spain has published an order, declaring the Caraccas, in confequence of the revolution there, in a flate of blockade. This order, however, comprehends only a part of Caraccas. Two Spanish fail of the line have been fent out to enforce the blockade.

A Gottenburg mail brought an account, that Servia is to be united to Auffria.

LONDON, September 6. General Armftrong lately preferred feveral of his countrymen at the Thuilleries. Bonaparte addreshing one of them who had lately returned from England, faid brusquement, " Do you think the British will permit your vellet. to navigate the ocean-you fee I have removed their apologies for obffructing your commerce? To be a great nation you fhould fuffain your flag. and fuffain it by your cannon," Without waiting for a reply he turned to General Armftrong, and affect him if he was not going home, and when Congress would meet? and then paffed to another part of the circle .- The attention of Bonaparte to the Emprefs, who was prefent and evidently pregnant, is extreme.
