THEREAS the times of holding the terms of the Supreme Court, as now by Ordinance eflablished, have been found inconvenient, I have therefore thought fit, by and with the advice and confent of His MAJESTY'S Council, to ordain and declare, and I do by these presents ordain and declare that after the next Eafter Term the times of holding the faid Terms shall be as follows, that is to fay, the Trinity Term to commence on the fecond Tuesday in July; the Michaelmas Term on the fecond Tuesday in October ; the Hilary Term on the third Tuesday in February; and the Easter Term on the third Tuesday in May, in each and every year, and the faid Terms shall continue from the faid Tuesdays respectively until the Saturday following on which day they fhall feverally determine and end ; any former Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding. And of this regulation His MAJESTY'S Juffices of the faid Supreme Court and all others whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themfelves accordingly.
