A PROCLAMATION.

DY Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me D in and by an Act of Parliament made and palled in the Twenty-eighth Year of His MAJESTY's Reign, intitled " An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of " His MAJESTY'S Colonies and Plantations in North-" America and in the Weft-India Islands, and the Coun-" tries belonging to the United States of America, and be-" tween His MAJESTY's faid Subjects and the Foreign " Iflands in the Weft-Indies." I do, by and with the advice and confent of His MAJESTY's Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any fort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any fort; Bread, Bifcuit, Flour, Peafe, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley, or Grain of any fort, to be imported into this Province by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned and navigated according to Law, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for and during the term of Six Months from this date: And of this Proclamation all Perfons whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
