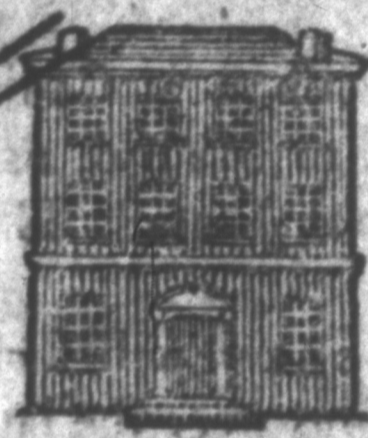

 Province stands prorogued to the First Tuesday of
 this instant OCTOBER; I have therefore thought fit, by

 hereby prorogued to the First Tuesday in JANUARY next
 ensuing.

A PROCLAMATION.
 BY Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me
 in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in
 the Twenty-eighth Year of His MAJESTY'S Reign, intituled
 "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of
 His MAJESTY'S Colonies and Plantations in North-
 America and in the West-India Islands, and the Coun-
 tries belonging to the United States of America, and be-
 tween His MAJESTY'S said Subjects and the Foreign
 "Islands in the West-Indies." I do, by and with the ad-
 vice and consent of His MAJESTY'S Council, publish this
 Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scamling,
 Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or
 Squared Timber of any sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep,
 Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit,
 Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Bar-
 ley, or Grain of any sort, to be imported by British Subjects
 in British built Ships, owned by His MAJESTY'S Sub-
 jects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the Ter-
 ritories belonging to the United States of America, for and
 during the term of SIX MONTHS from the first day of
 July next:—And of this Proclamation all Persons whom it
 may concern will take due notice and govern themselves
 accordingly.
