I do, by and with the advice and consent of His MAJESTY'S Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Stantling, Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley, or Grain of any sort, to be imported by British Subjects in British built Ships, owned by His MAJESTY'S Subjects, and navigated according to Law, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for and during the term of SIX MONTHS from the first day of July next:—And of this Proclamation all Persons whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
