## A PROCLAMATION.

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DY Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me D in and by an Act of Parliament made and paffed in the Twenty-eighth Year of His MAJESTY's Reign, intituled " An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of " His MADESTY's Colonies and Plantations in North-" America and in the West-India Illands, and the Coun-" tries belonging to the United States of America, and be-"tween His MAJESTY's faid Subjects and the Foreign " Islands in the West-Indies." I do, by and with the advice and confent of His MAJESTY's Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scantling. Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any fort; Horfes, Neat-Cattle, Sheep. Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any fort ; Bread, Bifcuit. Flour, Peale, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Bar. ley, or Grain of any fort, to be imported by British Subjects in British built Ships, owned and navigated according to Law, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for and during the term of Six Months from the first day of JANUARY next :- And of this Proclamation all Perfons whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themfelves accordingly. GIVEN under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the thirtieth day of December, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Eight, and in the Forty-ninth Year of His MAJESTY's Reign.
