

BOSTON, FEBRUARY 15.
SPANISH PAPERS.

We have seen a file of the official *Madrid Gazettes* to the 29th November. They contain numerous accounts of military operations, in which success seldom deserted the patriotic standards; and no indications of any severe reverses. It appeared, however, that a party of the French had advanced to *Soria*, on one side; and that Gen. FRIAS, who commanded the patriot army of *Extremadura* had retired to *Somosierra* [about 60 miles from Madrid]. But on the 15th November, Gen. PALAFOX wrote from *Calaborra*, that the French had evacuated *Caparossa*, and had retreated to *Penalta*. In *Catalonia* General VIVES had given battle to the French, and it was said had taken *Rosas*. He had declared *Barcelona* in a state of rigid siege. Troops were continually passing the interior towns on their march to the armies. The English Ambassador to the Supreme Junta was received in great style, at *Aranjuez*, the 14th Nov.—Don CEVALLOS was present. The official publication of the Supreme Junta breathed the most determined spirit; and their tables were covered with addresses of congratulation on their progress, of confidence in their patriotism, and devotion to the holy cause of the country.—They state their men in arms at 400,000. Every paper contained columns of patriotic donations, from the widow's mite, to gifts of 50,000 reals each. We have seen no accounts of the progress of the British army, excepting that under the head of *Badajoz*. Nov. 12. it is stated, that on the 27th October, the 2d, 36th, 71st and 92d regiments of foot passed that city for *Castile*; and were followed on the 7th November, by the 18th regt. of light dragoons. Business appeared very brisk at *Cadiz*;—On the 14th of Nov., the *Francisco de Paula*, of 74 guns, sailed for *Vera Cruz*, conveying six vessels for that port; three for *Havana*; two for *Honduras*: one for *Maracaibo*; six for *Monte Viedo*, and *Buenos Ayres*; and one for *Carthagena*.

Extract of a letter, dated, Liverpool, Nov. 29, 1808.

"On the 26th inst. an American schooner arrived here, said to be from New-York, loaded with 400 bls, turpentine, and 41 bales cotton; she brought one of the owners out, who I understand is a Mr. Marshall, a Scotch gentleman; but as he is without papers, the Captain of the Princess frigate, seized her yesterday, and she will probably be condemned as a *Droit of admiralty*. I understand the American Consul has taken cognizance of this breach of the laws of his country, and that the American minister has been made acquainted with the fact.—I think the schooner's name was *Jane*. Be so good as to publish in the newspapers for the information of gentlemen who are disposed to evade the measures government has resorted to, that all such vessels will be seized, and that they are liable to condemnation."

BY Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of His MAJESTY'S Reign, intituled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His MAJESTY'S Colonies and Plantations in North-America and in the West-India Islands, and the Countries belonging to the United States of America, and between His MAJESTY'S said Subjects and the Foreign Islands in the West-Indies." I do, by and with the advice and consent of His MAJESTY'S Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley, or Grain of any sort, to be imported by British Subjects in British built Ships, owned and navigated according to Law, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for and during the term of Six Months from the first day of JANUARY next:—And of this Proclamation all Persons whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
