**MARTIN HUNTER,**  
A PROCLAMATION.  
WHEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this  
Province stands prorogued to the Second Tuesday  
in DECEMBER next; I have thought fit, by and with the  
advice of His MAJESTY'S Council, further to prorogue  
the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby pro-  
rogued to the Fourth Tuesday in JANUARY next ensuing,  
then to meet at Fredericton for the dispatch of business.  
GIVEN under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton,  
the twenty-eighth day of November in the year  
of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and  
Nint, and in the Fiftieth year of His Majesty's  
Reign.

**MARTIN HUNTER,**  
A PROCLAMATION.  
BY Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me  
in and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in  
the Twenty-eighth Year of His MAJESTY'S Reign, intituled  
"An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of  
His MAJESTY'S Colonies and Plantations in North-  
America and in the West-India Islands, and the Coun-  
tries belonging to the United States of America, and be-  
tween His MAJESTY'S said Subjects and the Foreign  
Islands in the West-Indies." I do, by and with the ad-  
vice and consent of His MAJESTY'S Council, publish this  
Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scantling,  
Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or  
Squared Timber of any sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep,  
Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit,  
Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Bar-  
ley, or Grain of any sort, to be imported into this Province  
by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned and na-  
vigated according to Law, from any of the Territories be-  
longing to the United States of America, for and during  
the term of Six Months from this date: And of this Pro-  
clamation all Persons whom it may concern will take due  
notice and govern themselves accordingly.  
GIVEN under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the  
twenty-ninth day of August, in the Year of our Lord  
One Thousand Eight Hundred and Nine, and in  
the Forty-ninth Year of His MAJESTY'S Reign.
