A PROCLAMATION.

WITHEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this VV Province flands prorogued to the Second Tuelday in DECEMBER next; I have thought fit, by and with the advice of His MAJESTY's Council, further to prorogue the faid General Alfembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the Fourth Tuesday in JANUARY next enfuing, then to meet at Frederiction for the dispatch of business.

GIVEN under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the twenty-eighth day of November in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Nine, and in the Fiftieth year of His Majelly's Reign.

MARTIN HUNTER. A PROCLAMATION.

DY Virtue of the Power and Authority granted to me In and by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the Twenty-eighth Year of His MAJESTY's Reign, intitled "An Act for regulating the Trade between the Subjects of His MAJESTY's Colonies and Plantations in North-" America and in the West-India Islands, and the Coun-" tries belonging to the United States of America, and between His MAJESTY's faid Subjects and the Foreign "Illands in the West-Indies." I do, by and with the advice and confent of His MAJESTY's Council, publish this Proclamation, hereby authorizing and permitting Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any fort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any fort; Bread, Bifcuit, Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley, or Grain of any fort, to be imported into this Province by British Subjects, in British built Ships, owned and navigated according to Law, from any of the Territories belonging to the United States of America, for and during the term of Six Months from this date: And of this Proclamation all Persons whom it may concern will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
