ment of the Sellion, and the proper objects which were then pointed out to your attention, to give permanency to thole improvements, render it unnecellary for me to fay any thing upon thole topics.

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THE prefent afpect of the fublishing hollilities, and of our various national relations, and the probability that the Government of the United States will be ultimately actuated by enlightened views for the welfare of their country, under the favour of Providence, and through his Majelly's energetic and fuccessful exertions, seem to promile a continuance of the tranquillity which we have hitherto enjoyed, and which affords to bleffed a contrast to the calamities inflicted by the Almighty upon to large a portion of the world. Should any unforeseen events, however, require the employment of a Military force, our confidence in the regular croops supplied by his Majefly's paternal care for our defence, is greatly increased by the return of that able and experienced commander Maj. Gen. HUNTER; and the high flate of the discipline of the Militia, arising from the late regulations, feconded by the fpirit and ardor of individuals, affords a substantial pledge, that the province will likewife find an adequate protection in its own refources, and that its inhabitants are well qualified to difplay the noble union of the characters of the citizen and the foldier.

IN the mean time, I mull offer up my wilhes and pravers for the fuccels of the expedition; and that our worthy GOVERNOR may speedily return, crowned with fresh laurels in addition to those he has already so honorably acquired; when I may relign, with satisfaction, the administration of the Province into the hands of those who are so much more capable of conducting it. Spaniards to gain poffellion of the city of St. Domingo, the General did not command the troops himfelf; but on the following day, when he learned a large body of Spaniards from Porto Rico had landed, and things began to wear an alarming appearance, he marched out at the head of a very fine corps, on whom he placed the moll implicit confidence; but icarcely had he proceeded when the major part of them, who were Spaniards, and who were exafperated at the outrages of the French against their country, deferted his ranks, and joined their countrymen. Enraged to fee himfelf thus abandoned by his only hopes, Gen. Ferrand terminated his exiftence by blowing his own brains out with a piftol.— Still, however, they were unable to gain poffellion of the city, but retired to a firong poff to wait for reinforcements, when the attack was to be renewed."

CAP. LXX. An A& to provide that British Ships which shall be captured by the Enemy, and shall afterwards become the Property of British Subjects, shall not be entitled to the Privilege of British Ships. [18th June 1808.] THEREAS the allowing British-built Ships or Veffels which have been made Prize by the Enemy, and afterwards by Purchase become the Property of British Subjects, to be registered again as British Ships, renders fuch Captures more advantageous to the Enemy; be it enacled by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament allembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That from and after the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and eight, no British-built Ships or Veffel which has been captured by the Enemy, and which shall not have been registered de novo before the First Day of October One thousand eight hundred and eight, nor any Britishbuilt Ship or Veffel which shall hereafter be captured by the Enemy, thall be registered as a British-built Ship, or shall enjoy any of the Privileges and Advantages belonging to a British-built Ship; but every fuch Ship or Veffel, aithough owned by a British Subject or Subjects, shall be deemed and taken, to all Intents and Purposes, as a Foreign-built Ship or Veffel ; any Law, Cuftom, or Ufage,

Yesterday arrived here the Schooner Ann, Capt. Leavitt, in 7 days from Boston.—We have received papers to the 23d ult. by the Ann; from which, the following extracts have been made.

BOSTON, DECEMBER 19.

FROM WASHINGTON.—Communicated for the Baltimore Federal Gazette.—" Mr. Madison, Mr. Erskine, Mr. Howe, and several members of Congress, dined at Mr. Gallatin's on Friday. This circumslance in itself may not appear important; but I believe an honorable adjustment may yet be had with England; from Bonaparte we can expett nothing. However I must again repeat that, in my opinion, very unadvised general speculations are going on in the different sea ports. I speak not " as one having authority," but as a cantious private cirizen."

It is faid, fays the Richmond Enquirer, that Orders have been given to march all the force of the United States, South and Weft of the Deleware to New-Orleans. It is expected, that requifitions of 1000 militia from the Orleans and Millifippi Territories will be made—and that Congress will be called on for 2000 or 2500 feamen, to man the gun-boats and smaller ships—forty of which, it is expected, will be defined for Lake Pontchartrain and the Millifippi.

The New-York Gazette flates, that our government have received official accounts of the Revolution in Spain; as well as copies of all the acts and proclamations of the Junta at Seville; that Mr. Erving, by refufing to acknowledge King Joseph, had been treated with much refpect by the Supreme Junta, and affured, that the American veffels in the ports of Spain, under fequeilration, fhould be delivered up. Government have received difpatches from England to the 10th October, but they are faid to contain nothing of an intereffing nature. The Embargo is faid to have produced, in New-England, an immenfe influx of counterfeit Bank Bills; in New-York it has produced innumerable foot pads, burglars and midnight incendiaries. The Isle-Holt Prisoners-Escaped. Four of the prefons lately committed on the charge of Murder, have made their elcape from the jail at Caffine, on Tuesday night lass. We have not learnt the particularsbut understand it was done by perfons in disguise. It is said by a mob of 20 or 30 people who demanded the keys of the perfon who was the keeper, with a presented pistol. The real jailor was absent on business.

A letter from a Democratic Member of Congress at Washington, dated Dec. 15, says, "Mr. Elliot's annunciation that the Embargo was to be partially raised, has reached here—and we smile at it. Depend on it the Embargo will not be so removed. I, however, believe the Non-Intercourse Law will go into operation, unless some expected overtures arrives from Europe shortly. I believe some appropriation will be soon made for our suffering Mariners."

C LATEST FROM SOUTH OF SPAIN. The ship Julia, Capt. Snow, arrived here on Wednefday, from Valencia, via Gibraltar-Capt. S. left Valencia, Oct. 19, and the latter place the 24th-He reports, that the Spanish people are perfectly united in their Cause and new Government ;--- that Governors had been appointed to all the Provinces in the Kingdom;-that 4000 English troops had been landed near Valencia, from Portugal, and had marched and formed a junction with 71,000 Spaniards, who were drawing near, and invefling Barcelona, (which was by the laft accounts in polleflion of the French) but it was thought they could not hold out long, as Admiral Collingwood had a firong naval force blockading that port ;--that the French had, it was faid, 30,000 men at Perigon, for the relief of Barcelona, but that they had not attempted to enter ;---that the day before he left Valencia, an agent from the general government requefled him to flay a few days, to bring out Difpatches to the government of the United States, and to the Governors of the feveral States, the purport of which was to inform them, that, ALL SPANISH PORTS WERE OPEN TO NEUTRALS FOR A FREE TRADE .- The day he left Gibraltar, accounts had been received from Madrid, from the general Junta, announcing that all the American veffels, detained at Algebras, and other ports of Spain, should be immediately liberated.
