

Some other nominations, which we had before communicated to our readers. With respect to the accession of strength the new Ministers are likely to receive, it still continues to be reported that there is a probability they will be joined by Mr. Canning, or that at all events they will have his support, except on the Catholic question, which will be opposed by the majority of the Cabinet. The Earl of Chichester is mentioned as the successor of Earl Bathurst at the board of Trade; and it is rumoured that a proposition has been made to the Earl of Moira to succeed the Duke of Richmond as Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and that his Lordship has agreed to take the offer into consideration, upon an understanding that the petitions of the Catholics should be taken into consideration, and relief afforded them.
