

LONDON, MARCH 3.

The mystery in which the affairs of the North have been so long enveloped, seems to be on the point of being cleared up. From the accounts brought by the Anholt Mails which arrived yesterday, it appears, that BONAPARTE is determined to force the Northern Powers to make their election, without any further delay, between war and unconditional submission. The seizure of Swedish Pomerania has, if we may believe these letters, been followed up by a similar act of aggression against the territories of the KING of PRUSSIA, who, it is said, with some difficulty escaped from Berlin towards the north-eastern frontiers of his dominions.— We have been so frequently deceived by the accounts which have reached us from the North of Europe, that we are disposed to receive any intelligence from that quarter with considerable suspicion. The statements, however, contained in the letters to which we are alluding, are highly probable. If BONAPARTE is really determined upon a war with Russia, Prussia must, if possible, first be secured. We trust however, that the latter Power has derived some advantage from the fatal campaign in 1806, and that she will even now, reduced as she is, make a more formidable resistance than she did upon that occasion. From Sweden the news still continues to be favourable. The Government of that country appears to be anxious to remain upon amicable terms with Great-Britain, and it is positively stated, that a Minister from that country will very shortly arrive here.

MARCH 13.

Paris Papers have arrived to the 7th inst. Affairs in Turkey seem almost exclusively to occupy their attention. They inform us that the termination of the armistice between the Russian and Turks has been denounced, and that hostilities were expected to be renewed on the 8th of last month. The influence of France has no doubt led to the determination of the Turkish Government to reject all the proposals of Russia. The renewal of the war in Turkey may indispose Russia to a war with BONAPARTE; but the reason that induces her to wish to avoid war, will determine BONAPARTE to make an immediate attack upon her, which she can only avoid by sacrifices, that will probably be as ruinous to her, and certainly more humiliating, than the most disastrous war.

Her Majesty the Queen, and His Royal Highness the Prince Regent have been graciously pleased to appoint John Simeon, Esq; (one of the Masters of His Majesty's High Court of Chancery,) Count Munster and Colonel Herbet Taylor, to be Commissioners for the protection, care, and management, of His Majesty's property during His indisposition; and the said Commissioners took the necessary oaths thereupon before one of the Barons of the Court of Exchequer, on the 3d inst.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Act of Parliament passed in the forty-eighth year of His present MAJESTY'S Reign, power is given to the Governor, Lieutenant-Governor, or Commander in Chief, with the advice and consent of His MAJESTY'S Council, to allow the importation of certain enumerated articles from the United States of America into this Province, for the purpose of re-exporting the same.

I have therefore thought fit, with the advice and consent of His MAJESTY'S Council, to publish this Proclamation, hereby authorising and empowering British Subjects, for the space of Six Months from the date hereof, to import and bring into this Province, from the United States of America, in British built ships or vessels, owned and navigated according to Law: Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading, Boards, Shingles, Hoops, or Squared Timber of any sort; Horses, Neat-Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley or Grain of any sort; and British Subjects, during the same period, are hereby authorised and empowered to export in British ships, owned and navigated as aforesaid, all or any of the said herein before enumerated articles to any other of His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations.
