WHEREAS the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this Province stands prorogued to the second Tuesday in December next; I have thought fit, by and with the advice of His Majesty's Council, further to prorogue the said General Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued to the second Tuesday in January next, then to meet at Fredericton for the despatch of business.

A PROCLAMATION. TATHEREAS the United States of America have Declared WAR against HIS MAJESTY, I have thought fit, by and with the advice of HIS MAJESTY'S Council, to publish this Proclamation; and I do hereby order and direct that all Citizens of the said United States who may be within the limits of the Province, do without delay give information of their respective names and places of residence to one of the Magistrates, or to the Officer commanding any Military Post in the District of the County in which they respectively reside, to be by such Magistrate or Officer transmitted to me with all convenient speed, and do also conform to such directions as may by such Magistrate or Officer be given for their inoffensive conduct; and I do hereby further order and direct that no Citizen of the said United States do depart from this Province without permission first obtained from a Magistrate or from the Officer commanding in the District in which such Citizen may be at the time of his departure; and that all Citizens of the said United States who may at any time be found within this Province, and who shall refuse or neglect to observe and obey these several orders and directions, shall be treated as Prisoners of War, and all Magistrates and other Officers, Civil, and Military, are hereby required to take the necessary steps for carrying these orders and directions into immediate effect.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Fredericton, the thirtieth day of October, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twelve, and in the fifty-third Year of His Majesty's Reign.
