

BOSTON, SEPTEMBER 22.
Attack upon Lower Canada.

MONTPELIER, SEPTEMBER 17.
From all parts of the country we receive accounts of the movements of the troops and militia. Plattsburgh, (N. Y.) about 60 miles from Montreal, is their place of destination; where Generals Dearborn and Bloomfield, have already arrived, with about 2000 men each. The 6th regiment under Col. Simons; the 15th, Colonel Pike, and 13th, Col. Schuyler, all New-England troops, are on the march to join the army at Plattsburgh, under Gen. Dearborn; the 6th and 15th regiments from New-York, were to march the 31 instant. The Vermont troops are now at Plattsburgh. It is stated that Gen. Bloomfield, of New-York is to command the van of the army on the expedition.

About 80 of the U. S. troops from New-Hampshire, and between 4 and 500 of the drafted militia of this State, passed through town the present week, on their way to Plattsburgh.

From the best accounts we can collect, there are stationed between Montreal and St. Johns, from 12 to 15,000 troops, regulars and militia. The fields, says our informants, are literally covered with tents and camp equipage. The militia are well trained and completely equipped and uniformed. Should Gen. Dearborn enter the territory, he ought, (if he means not to be hull'd or defeated) to have 25 or 30,000 men, as not a doubt exists of the Governor of Canada being able to bring this force into the field against them.

The Springfield paper states, on the authority of advices from Albany, that 7000 British troops and Indians had marched from Montreal, and the vicinity of that place for the frontiers; their object supposed to be the capture of Plattsburgh, it is also further stated, that the place of rendezvous for the American army had been altered from Plattsburgh to Burlington, in Vermont.
