BOSTON, MAY 9.

An additional Embargo Act, to prevent the exportation from the United States of specie, produce or manufactures, foreign or domestic, during the continuance of the previous Act (5th of July next,) was signed by President Madison, on the 14th ult.—And thus, completely, is the American trade shut, and hermetically sealed up on all sides, by their own Government; and a measure adopted, which, while it operates to the ruin of thousands of the Citizens of a free Country, the sufferers are left to form their own conjectures, as to its origin and purport.

The National Intelligencer, the organ of the American Government, seems to vary its notes with every breath.—It has lately declared, that all hope of amicable accommodation with Great-Britain is at an end; and, anticipating the nature of the despatches, from France, expected by the Hornet, to be such as will lead to a favourable result with that Power, has already declared, that the final step ought to be taken, and "WAR forthwith proclaimed against England."
