

KING'S.

On Wednesday last from His Majesty's Dock Yard, at Point Frederick, the ship *Sir George Prevost*, of 30 guns—A Royal Salute was fired from the different vessels then in the harbor.

MONTREAL, MAY 22.

Extract of a Letter from an officer of high rank in the Army at the American Fort, at the falls of the Miami, dated.—May, 1813, to an Officer in this City.

"On the 5th instant, the Americans attacked our Positions on both sides of the River, 1500 having descended in thirty Boats: On the Western side they succeeded in carrying our Batteries—the Flankers of the 41st had only time to spike the guns;—the slaughter was severe on both sides—A reinforcement of 150 of the 41st and a fresh band of Indians changed the day, and the Americans were driven into the Fort with the loss of 500 prisoners, besides slain. General Proctor had summoned the Fort."

Extract of a Letter from York, dated 14th May, to a Gentleman at Kingston.

"I have to congratulate you on the intelligence this moment received from Niagara, a letter of the 6th inst. from Col. Elliott, mentions that on the 5th a partial engagement took place between Gen. Proctor and Harrison at the Miami's; at first the Americans took our guns, with some of the 41st Light Company that had charge of them, but immediately afterwards 150 of the 41st, accompanied by some Indians charged the enemy and recovered the guns and men, and made 550 prisoners and killed 80, the remaining part of the Americans consisting of 800 men retired to their fort—Gen. Proctor, pursued, and summoned them to surrender, the first summons was rejected, a second one was sent, and not answered, when Col. Elliott despatched his messenger—no doubt of an immediate surrender, was entertained.

"General Proctor's Despatch was delayed until the business should be finished, and is now hourly expected. This is a most cheering piece of intelligence to broken hearted devils as we are here.—The next step for General Proctor will be to send us a number of Indians to assist at Niagara, where they have completed all their preparations for the reception of the Americans, and are in the highest spirits, although their numbers are small in comparison with the enemy. Why don't you send troops round the Lake in Boats, there is now very little obstacle either way? General Vincent says, that one regiment more would enable him to despise every effort in the enemy's power. We long for intelligence from Kingston, but you appear to think the upper part of the Province of no consequence."
