

QUEBEC, MAY 18.

It is with no small pleasure that we announce in this day's paper the arrival of His Majesty's ship of war *CYGNET*, with a number of transports, containing the 19th light dragoons, the 2d battalion of the 41st regiment of foot, and recruits as well for the different regiments in the country, as for Wattville's, Meuron's, the 13th and 89th regiments, not yet arrived; but which consequently, may soon be expected. We hear that Wattville's and Meuron's are each a thousand strong. These, added to the seamen before arrived, are pretty strong symptoms that we are not quite forgot by the government at home. When we reflect on the defence of the country made by our peace establishment only, what may not be expected with a war complement of troops in the country! Let us once have the decided superiority we have a right to look for, on the lakes, and the numbers of our inveterate foe, divided as their strength must be by the number of diversions on their back and front, will shrink into the most contemptible insignificance. We trust that the period is not very remote when the neighborhood of American citizens will be removed to a more convenient distance from Upper Canada than is the case at this day, so as entirely to free the lakes from such unpleasant co-navigators.

For some days past this town has been quite in a bustle. It was particularly the case on Sunday, when the whole day was employed in shipping stores, besides carpenters at work in the riding house making and putting up mangers for the cavalry horses; about 70 of which are arrived. The remainder of the dragoons, consisting of about 500 in the whole, will be mounted in the country.

On Friday set off from this garrison, for Upper Canada, 50 of the Artillery; on Sunday six companies of the 103d regiment; and yesterday the greater part of the 2d battalion of the 41st regiment, with the recruits for the different regiments above.

With the troops arrived General Durroch and family.

The remarkable short passage of the fleet with the above mentioned troops, cannot fail of striking our readers, as something of a providential event. They arrived in a month from Ireland. The transports all sailed well, and have great credit for keeping together as well as their strict obedience to the signals of the ships of war, by which they were convoyed, being the frigates *Arma* and *Sybil*, in addition to the *Cygnets*. The 2 former went to Halifax and St. Johns.
