LONDON, APRIL 13.

Some more verbal *thunderings* have recently reached us from France. A *Senatus Consultum* decrees that 180,000 men shall be added to the 350,000 lately voted; and these additions, it is asserted, will enable Bonaparte to have 400,000 men on the Elbe, 200,000 in Spain, and 200,000 partly on the Rhine, and in Italy.

The following clause which shews how the Emperor feels, with respect to his remaining allies, is the only one worth extracting from this boastful decree.

"You well know Gentlemen, the spirit and foresight which always guides his Majesty's designs, and thus to prevent every kind of danger, and even of inquietude, he has deemed it necessary to organize an army of reserve, which, encamped on our frontiers will at the same time watch for their defence, and maintain order among our Allies."

The gallant Blucher has issued two spirited Proclamations on entering the Saxon territories. One to his troops—the other to the Saxons. He is one of the best Generals in Europe. Our readers recollect the noble stand he made against the French with an inferior force in the streets of Lubeck.

The report of the Austrian Minister being about to leave this country is untrue, he has just despatched a Courier to Vienna.
