IMPERIAL PARLIAMENT.

House of Commons, May 22.

The Regent's Message.

Lord Castlereagh appeared at the Bar of
the House, and announced a Message from
His Royal Highness the Prince Regent,
which was read by the Speaker, as follows:
"G. P. R.

"His Royal Highness the Prince Regent,
acting in the name and on the behalf of his
Majesty, thinks it right to inform his faith-
ful Commons, that in consequence of events
which have recently taken place in France,

in direct contravention of the Treaty enter-
ed into at Paris last year for preserving the
peace of Europe, has judged it necessary to
enter into engagements with his Allies, to
adopt such steps as circumstances may re-
quire against the common enemy, and for
preventing the revival of measures which
could only have for their object to destroy
the Peace and Liberties of Europe; and his
Royal Highness confidently relies upon the
House of Commons to support him in such
steps as he may find it necessary to take, in
conjunction with his Allies, at this momen-
tous crisis.

"His Royal Highness has given orders
that copies of the Treaties into which he has
entered with the Allies should immediately
be laid before the House for its information."
