

April 25.

A French General has been arrested on the German side of the Rhine. The Grand Duke of Tuscany has fled his capital, as well as the Pope, who is now at Vienna. Murat is said to have taken possession of Rome, in the name of the young King of Rome. The Emperor Alexander, upon receiving the news of Bonaparte's landing, exclaimed, "the thing is trifling, if we do not treat it as a trifle." That his Majesty does not so treat it appears from a Breslau article, which states, that 80,000 Russians will pass through that place in the course of the present month, and that 245,000 are expected, upon the whole.

Some accounts state, that in many districts in France, the decrees for calling out the young men of 1813 and 1814, are openly set at naught. The youths do not, as formerly, abound, but positively refuse to march.

In the Artillery Department, our army in Belgium is particularly strong. The Duke of Wellington will be enabled to take the field with not less than 700 pieces of field artillery. The travelling equipage of the Duke was sent off on Thursday.

Letters of the 10th inst. from St. Sebastian announce, that it is the full determination of the King of Spain to take an active part in the cause against Bonaparte. Every disposition was making to that end; and an embargo had been laid upon all French vessels in the ports of Spain.

Two French Officers (one holding the rank of General, the other of a Colonel) landed here yesterday from Caen. They left the port in an open boat, and were picked up by a vessel coming to this port. A requisition had been made at Caen for a certain quota of men to join the army, but not an individual had turned out. At Havre, also, the same disinclination was manifested.—These Officers are of opinion that Bonaparte will not long retain his authority in France: they do not intend to return to the Country until the event which they anticipate transpires.

**SAINT JOHN, THURSDAY, JUNE 8, 1815.**

Just as our Paper was preparing for the Press, we were favoured with the Halifax Journal of the 5th inst.—containing London advices to the 26th April, and from Paris to the 24th—from which we have selected a variety of interesting and important matter for this day's Gazette.

The 99th Regt. which was destined for Halifax, has received counter-orders to remain in New-Brunswick. The troops which have been on ship board, for some days, waiting for a favorable wind to proceed, we understand, will disembark immediately.

**HALIFAX, JUNE 5.**

Saturday arrived the brig Reward, Todd, 30 days from Martinique—and yesterday the ship Belle, Carlisle, from Liverpool, 37 days.—By the Reward, we learn, that the intelligence of Bonaparte's return to Paris, had reached Martinique—that the Troops there had declared in favor of Bonaparte—and that the Governor had sent to Barbadoes for a British Force to take possession of the Island.

By the Belle we learn, that the ship Palas, from Liverpool for this place, had put back in consequence of having sprung a leak—and would have to discharge her Cargo.

We have been very obligingly favoured with London and Plymouth papers brought by the Ackbar—the former to the 27th April, the latter to the 29th—and have extracted from them much interesting intelligence.

On the 25th March, a Treaty between England, Russia, Austria and Prussia, was signed by the respective Plenipotentiaries of those Powers at Vienna. They adhere to the Treaty of Chaumont, and that of the Congress of Vienna—bind themselves to defend the said Treaties—to furnish, and equip for the field, each 150,000 men, and, "should the King of France desire it, to employ them in active and united exertions against the common enemy: not to lay down their arms until Bonaparte shall be wholly and completely deprived of the power of exciting disturbances, and of being able to renew his attempts to obtain the chief power in France."

We have copied from one of the papers an excellent Proclamation of the King of Prussia—alluding to the recent changes in France, and ordering his armies into immediate readiness to march against Bonaparte. The Emperor of Austria has declared War against the King of Naples—and some fighting, it will be seen by the extracts we have made, has taken place between their respective armies.
