Whilst we are marching to Carraccas, general Marino at the head of a formidable corps, attacks Cumana; general Piar, reinforced by generals Roxas and Monagas, become master of the plains (Uanos) advances to Barcelona, and general Arismendi with his victorious army occupies Margarita.

LONDON, JULY 14.

It is stated in letters from the Mediterranean, that a captain of one of his Majesty's frigates had, by going on shore, fallen into the hands of the Algerines, who, with the most refined cruelty, nailed him to a cross, making him suffer the most excruciating torture. Some Turks who were present, moved to pity by his sufferings, attempted to relieve him, but were shot dead for their humane interference. The captain's name is given in the letter which communicates the intelligence; but we forbear to mention it without further corroboration of the fact.

Papers from New-York, Boston, Washington, Bangor, Dover, Quebec, Montreal, Halifax, Newfoundland and St. John, all of late dates, have been received since our last, from them we have extracted as much as our limits will admit of.

General Toledo the leader of the voluntary forces in the Spanish Provinces bordering on the United States, arrived at Alexandria in a vessel from New-Orleans, and is gone Northwardly. His object is not known.

Petion has been named President for life (of his part of Hay-ti) by a convention which assembled to amend the constitution.

The Algerines value their slaves at 1000 dollars each; the Tunisians at 650 dollars. The states of Morocco have discontinued their system of Slavery; they have only two or three old frigates which are chiefly employed in carrying pilgrims to and from Alexandria on their way to Mecca.

Marshals Monecy and Suchet has been restored to favor and service by Louis XVIII.

A London Black-leg infesting these Provinces.

A very genteel looking person 5 feet 6, or 7 inches high, calling himself ALEXANDER ATHERTON, lately from London, via New-York; and (to different persons) assuming the characters of Clergyman of the established Church, Merchant, Lawyer, Schoolmaster, &c. visited this City last week and has swindled persons to a considerable amount; several articles are missing from his lodgings, particularly a black silk waistcoat and a pair of silver tea spoons not marked, which no doubt were taken by him. It is ascertained that he left this

on Wednesday morning last in a schooner belonging to Mr. APPELBY, for Moose-Island; has a companion with him who he calls Captain—endeavoured while here to get English stamp Bills of Exchange and applied at the Office of this paper to get envelopes for letters printed, with "On His Majesty's Service," upon them; these circumstances together with his having swindled several persons here, fully corroborate the opinion that he is a professed swindler; he has a large quarto Bible with him, a suit of plain naval uniforms which he has swindled persons out of here and carries with him a quantity of United States Bank paper, and of the Steam Boat Company; occasionally exhibits a Certificate signed JOHN W. CROKER, Esq. Secretary of the Admiralty, certify his having served as Chaplain in one of His Majesty's ships. He wore a black coat, blue pantaloons, and black bound waist-coat with glass buttons; he is a smart, good looking man, and his affability will enable him to pass unsuspected in any company.
