It is still our pleasing task to communicate the rapid improvements which are taking place in the Manufacturing districts. The demand for labour is increasing: and this, coupled with the diminished price in the articles of subsistence, will soon restore good order and contentment. In the stock-trade of Leicester, few, if any, frames are now unemployed, and the workmen there, in a public advertisement, have declared, that they now earn wages that will enable them, by honest industry, to maintain themselves and families, without having recourse to the assistance of parochial relief. In the large parish of Wigton, only where there are many stocking makers, there is not now one unemployed. This cheering and consolatory prospect, consolatory not merely as affecting the general interests of the Empire, but as indicative of amelioration in the condition of an industrious and suffering population, is not confined to any particular district, but more or less extends throughout the country. The bar iron trade in Wales, Shropshire and Staffordshire, is in so flourishing a condition, that the iron masters would rather decline orders, even at the advanced prices, for they cannot execute the demands so fast as they receive them. The nail trade likewise, is so much on the advance, that the manufacturers again employ those men, who, during the winter months were compelled to seek a scanty support by labouring on the highways. The same activity prevails in the clothing towns of Bradford and Trowbridge, where trade is much brisker than has been known for several months. Let us hope, therefore, that the inevitable calamities, attendant upon a transition from war to peace, are at length passing away, and that in our restoration to a healthful condition of commercial prosperity, we shall deprive the malignant and disaffected of the matter of sedition.

The London Gazette of July 26, notifies, that the Duke of Northumberland has taken the oaths on his appointment as Lord Lieutenant of that County; that the Prince Regent has conferred the honor of Knighthood on W. H. Robinson, Commissary General in Canada; and permitted the 34th Foot to bear on their colours and appointments the word "Victoria." It also contains the proceedings of the Chapter held for electing Lord Bathurst a Knight of the Garter.

An English frigate has arrived at Leghorn to take on board five millions in specie. This sum is a reimbursement to England from the King of Sardinia for the expenses of the war.

PIRATES IN THE INDIAN SEAS.

The following are extracts of letters received by the Governor of Port Louis, from the Right Honourable the Governor in Council at Madras:

Extract of a Letter from the Resident at Bushire, dated the 28th Nov. 1816.

"They have now at sea fifteen sail of boats cruising to the Southward, between Cape Rasclate and Muscat; five sail up the Gulph, between Cape Verdistan, Bushire, and Bussora, and four sail ready for sea, lying off the town, and intended to sail in a few days to cruise in the Gulph; besides these, they have about forty or fifty sail of vessels in the harbour for emergencies. That the Joasmers will now consider all further ties of amity at an end, there can be little doubt, and that they will attack all vessels they may meet with. All merchant ships, therefore, coming to the Gulph, ought to be advised to be on their guard, and be capable to repel attacks from boats."

Extract of a Letter from Captain H. P. Bridges, of His Majesty's ship Challenger, without date.

"Their power at sea, in and out of the Gulf, is every great, comparatively with our merchant vessels, who, without doubt, will be all captured, if they come singly, as the Lascars in general have an idea that if they do not fight at all, their lives will be spared; every ship must fall without a chance of escape. The Challenger will do her utmost to protect the trade, and can do it completely with one or two cruisers."

"Your Excellency will understand it to be my intention, till I receive further orders from you to arrange regular convoys, between Muscat, Bushire, and Bussora, and as I am aware of the number of ships likely to come up the Gulf, I hope to be able to ensure the safety of the British trade, till your Excellency's intention of humbling these horrid pirates can be carried into execution."—Stb.
