GENTLEMEN,

With reference to the Letter of this Board of 26th April last, respecting Fees to be taken by the Officers of the Customs in the West Indies—I am now commanded by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury to desire you will further direct your Collectors and Comptrollers, and other Officers in the British Colonies and Plantations in America, not to require from the Captain of any Ship more than One General Certificate of the Landing of the Cargo, and in the Cases of Certificates required by Individuals to cancel Bonds given in this Country, to include therein all the Goods enumerated in one Cocquet, although differently marked and numbered; at the same time authorizing and empowering the Collection of the under-mentioned fees, which my Lords think it reasonable to allow for the same, viz.

For a general Certificate of the Landing the Cargo of each Ship, } 2 Dollars.
For a Certificate required by Individuals to cancel Bonds given in this Country, } 1 Dollar.

The said Fees to be divided between the Collector and the Comptroller, in the proportion of two thirds to the former, and one third to the latter Officer.

GENTLEMEN,

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having by Mr. Lushington's Letter of the 27th ult. directed, that the Officers of this Revenue in the British Colonies and Plantations shall not require from the Captain of any Ship more than one general Certificate of the landing of a Cargo, and that in the cases of Certificates required by Individuals to cancel Bonds given in this Country, the same shall include all the Goods enumerated in one Cocquet although differently marked and numbered; and their Lordships having been also pleased to allow the Officers to receive certain Fees for such Certificates:

Inclosed you will receive a Copy of the said Letter, and We direct you to take care that the Commands therein contained be duly and strictly obeyed, so far as you are concerned.

You will receive also herewith, Form of a Notice, which has been prepared by Our Orders relative to such Fees; and We direct you to cause the same to be published three times in the public Gazette, and to be affixed up in the several Offices, and in the most public parts of the Custom-House at your Port, as well as the Out Bays, for the Information of all Parties interested therein.

The Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs, in pursuance of Directions received from the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury,

Hereby give Notice,

That in future no more than one general Certificate of the landing of any Cargo shall be required from the Captain of any Ship; and in cases of Certificates required by Individuals to cancel Bonds given in Great-Britain, all the Goods enumerated in one Cocquet be included therein, although differently marked and numbered: And that for such Documents the following Fees be allowed upon the same, viz:

For a general Certificate of the Landing the Cargo of each Ship, } 2 Dollars.
For a Certificate required by Individuals to cancel Bonds given in this Country, } 1 Dollar.

The said Fees to be divided between the Collector and Comptroller, in the proportion of two-thirds to the former, and one-third to the latter officer.

FREDERICTON, (N. B.)

14TH OCTOBER, 1817.

From the 'Free Press' Mature Memorandum, October 7.

Brig Jesse, Williams, bound for Saint Andrews, put in for provisions on Tuesday, having on board part of the Crew and passengers of the Ship Lutera, Matthews, master, which foundered at sea, in lat. 46, long. 31, on the 10th Sept. having sprung a leak two days previous; twenty persons were saved in the long boat having been picked up about four o'clock on the same afternoon; the names of the persons who perished were James Dunkens, Murray, Mr. Black and wife, Archd. McDonald, wife, 6 children, Donald Campbell, father, mother and sister; Laughlin M'Neil, wife, and two children. — Smith and wife, Mr. Mullin, mother and sister, and a young man named M'Guire. Passengers saved—Mr. Hall and Brother, Messrs Weston, Ross, J. M'Gregor, Duncan Darrack. — The Captain and Cabin Passengers were put on board a vessel bound for Philadelphia.

A particular account of the above melancholy occurrence will be given in our next.

Thirty workmen (says a London paper) on the 24th of July, commenced digging a place on the south Downs at Yarmouth, 50 feet square and 16 deep, to place the foundation of a Column to be raised to the memory of Lord Nelson.

Montreal, Sept. 13. It is stated in some of the papers that Major Gen. Sir Peregrine Maitland, from the Staff of the Duke of Wellington's army, is about to succeed Gen. Wilson, in Upper Canada, and that he will be Lieut. Governor of that Province.

Quebec, Sept. 13. — The whole number of vessels arrived at this port from sea, since the opening of the navigation is 245. The number of settlers chiefly from Great-Britain, already arrived, is 4857; we understand that about 200 are shortly expected from Germany.

It may be observed in answer to the Speculations of the Opposition Writers, who so confidently assert that Russia is going to assist Spain in the reductions of her Colonies, that Russia is at this time very much in want of money, and the eagerness with which it is attempted to raise a Loan in this Country is a full proof of that want. It is also probable that this is not the only Country in which Russia is endeavouring to strengthen her finances by a similar measure. In such a situation of affairs, therefore, it is by no means very likely that she should be disposed to engage in a War, whatever ulterior advantages may be proposed to her. Spain, in point of financial embarrassments, is nearly in the same condition with Russia, and therefore can offer her no assistance in this respect. But as we do not pretend to be as well acquainted with the Cabinet Secrets of either of those Powers as the Morning Chronicle, we shall leave the profound Politicians of that Paper to balance the probabilities of War and Peace, and to favour the World with more authentic information.
