Longevity .- A Gentleman of considerable research lately made a catalogue of nearly 800 persons who had attained a great age, and found their habits of life only to agree in one particular ; namely, early rising.

Dr. Romershaused, at Acken, on the Elba, has invented a pocket telescope, by means of which objects and distances can be measured with certainty and exactness. He calls it a diastimeter. It has three sides. Instead of the eye-glass, there is a brass plate with a very small hole in it; and instead of the object-glass, there are 16 threads stretched across the lower orifice. Looking at a distan: object ; for example a man or a steeple ; the slides of the telescope are drawn out till the object appears quite fitted as it were between the parallel threads, and then the figures engraved upon the slides indicate the number of paces which the object is distant from the observer.

The lump soon began to decrease, after the commencement of the above treatment, and in less than three weeks totally disappeared, had several scurvy places about me, one near one of my eyes, which had been troublesome for several years past ; I tried the decoction to them, as to the other, with the like success.


