

**Longevity.**—A Gentleman of considerable research lately made a catalogue of nearly 800 persons who had attained a great age, and found their habits of life only to agree in one particular; namely, early rising.

Dr. Romershaused, at Acken, on the Elba, has invented a *pocket telescope*, by means of which objects and distances can be measured with certainty and exactness. He calls it a *diastimeter*. It has three sides. Instead of the eye-glass, there is a brass plate with a very small hole in it; and instead of the object-glass, there are 16 threads stretched across the lower orifice. Looking at a distant object; for example a man or a steeple; the slides of the telescope are drawn out till the object appears quite fitted as it were between the parallel threads, and then the figures engraved upon the slides indicate the number of paces which the object is distant from the observer.
