He was, however, of opinion in this case, that the plantiff had a right to recover ; and farther, that if the plaintiff had even broken into the defendant's garden, the action would lie. "Surely," said the Judge, " the law never intended to give any man the right of shooting another for so trivial a trespass as that alleged to have been committed by the poor unfortunate plaintiff, in this case." --- Verdic, for the plantiff, damages £126 costs 49s.
