New-Brunswick Legislature

Extract from the Journals of the House of Assembly.

THURSDAY 13TH MARCH,

The Committee appointed to prepare a Bill in addition to and amendment of an Act, intituled an Act for the establishment, regulation and improvement of the great Roads of Communication throughout the Province, presented the same, which was read a first time.

On motion, ordered that the resolution of the 11th instant, granting to His Honor the PRESIDENT, the sum of £2000 for the purpose of encouraging emigrants from Great-Britain and Ireland be rescinded.

Mr. Wetmore gave notice that he should to-morrow move the House—that the expenses incurred by the attendance of the Witnesses on the Petition of William Peters, complaining of the undue Election of Richard Yeamans for Queen's County, be defrayed by the said William Peters.

Read an engrossed Bill "to regulate the exportation of dutiable Articles from and out of this Province."

Ordered thereupon that the Bill do pass, and that Mr. Millidge and Mr. Simonds, do carry the same to the Council and desire their concurrence.

Read a second time, a Bill "in addition to and amendment of an Act, intituled "An Act for the establishment, regulation and improvement of the great Roads of Communication throughout the Province."

Ordered that the same Bill be now committed.

The House, according to order, resolved itself into a committee of the whole House, upon the consideration of the Bill "in addition to and amendment of an Act, intituled "An Act for the establishment, regulation and improvement of the great Roads of Communication throughout the Province."

Mr. Agnew took the Chair of the Committee.

A Message from the Council.

"Mr. Speaker,
"I am named by the Council, a Committee to manage the conference on the subject matter of the Resolution of the Assembly respecting reserves;"

Mr. Agnew resumed the Chair of the committee.

Mr. Agnew from the Committee, reported that he was directed by the Committee to report that they had gone through the Bill to them referred, and had agreed to the same with amendments.

Ordered that the report be accepted, and the Bill as amended be engrossed.

Read a second time a Bill "to prevent disorderly galloping and racing Horses in any Town or Village within this Province."

Ordered that the same Bill be now committed.

The House, according to order, resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House,

upon the consideration of the Bill "to prevent disorderly galloping and racing Horses in any Town or Village within this Province."

Mr. Humbert took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Humbert from the Committee, reported that he was directed by the Committee to report that they had gone through the Bill to them referred, and had agreed to the same with amendments.

Ordered that the report be accepted, and the Bill as amended be engrossed.

The Committee appointed to manage the conference on the part of the House, on the subject matter of their resolution respecting reserves, reported that they had attended the conference, and met Mr. Justice Chipman, the Committee appointed to manage the same on the part of the Council, from whom they received the following resolution, to wit.

Council Chamber, 12th March 1817.

Resolved, that the Committee of conference on the subject of the resolution of the Assembly, respecting reserves, be instructed to state to the Committee of the Assembly, that a Petition signed by a great number of the inhabitants of the County of Charlotte, has been presented to His Honor the President and the Council, praying that such steps may be taken as may be thought most expedient for removing the restrictions mentioned in the resolution of the Assembly, and that the Council are of opinion that it is advisable that a joint Address of the Council and Assembly, be presented to His Honor the President, requesting him to adopt such measures upon the subject matter of the said Petition, as to him may appear expedient.

Resolved, that this House do concur with the Council, that a joint Address of the Council and Assembly, be presented to His Honor the President, requesting him to adopt such measures upon the subject matter of the Petition of a number of the inhabitants of Charlotte County, as to His Honor may appear expedient.

Ordered that Mr. Pagan and Mr. Campbell, do acquaint the Council therewith, and also join such Committee as may be appointed by the Council.

The House, according to order, resolved itself into a Committee on the further consideration of supplies to be granted for the Public Service.

Mr. Pagan took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Pagan from the Committee, reported that he was directed to report that the Committee had come to the following resolutions:

Resolved that the sum of £15 17 3 be granted to Nehemiah Merrit and Robert James, being amount of Drawbacks on 423 gallons of Rum exported by them in the Schooner Perseverance for Boston; it appearing that the proper papers could not be obtained at the time of the shipment, owing to the sickness of the late Treasurer.

To Ezekiel Barlow the sum of £24 7 6 for Drawbacks on 6 Puncheons of Rum, containing 650 gallons, by him exported to Nova-Scotia; it appearing that he was not able to obtain the same at the time of exportation, owing to the sickness of the late Treasurer.

And that he was directed by the Committee to move for leave to sit again.

Ordered that the report be accepted and leave granted.
