A letter from Madrid, of the 2d of Jan, says, " Our Gazette publishes nothing new : it continues to be filled with harrangues of felicitations on the King's marriage. We have here three Ambassadors, nominated to different Courts ; the Duke del Parque, to Paris; M. de Cevallos, to Naples; and M. de Bardaxi, to Troin. None of them seem under the necessity of soon proceeding on their destination .- No news from America : this silence is painful." Mr. Brougham has arrived at Paris on his return from Italy. He was present yesterday at the debates of the Chamber of Deputies on the law relative to personal liber:y Letters from Warsaw entirely contradict the pretended intelligence of an extraordinary levy of conscripts in Portland. The Republic of Geneva has decreed the rights of citizenship to the Court Cape, d'Istria, the Russian Minister to the Helvetic Republic. The decree was presented in a superb gold box. The King of Portugal is expected at Lisbon on a visit to his European territories in May next. The King and Queen of Spain, the infant Don Carlos, and Portuguese Princess, his wife, will proceed with the whole court to Badajoz, and the two Sovereigns will have an interview beyond the Guadiana. The is a curious document from Constantinople : it is a kind of " State of the Nation " at the close of 1816, and from it we learn the curious fact, that the Holy Alliance of the European Sovereigns, nearly frightened the Turks out of their senses.
