

The friction of the gudgeon of the wheel spindle, and that he forewarned his fellow laborers that they were inevitably lost as the mill was on fire. He states that immediately afterwards, the explosion must have taken place; and that as soon as he recovered he found himself immersed in the water. The escape of one of the sufferers may indeed be called providential. He was blown by the first explosion, as he states, from one mill on the roof of another; another explosion immediately afterwards ensued, by which this unhappy victim of the second explosion was thrown on the water wheel, and from thence into the water. A young girl who lived in the vicinity of the mill, ran in that direction to call her father; when the first accident took place, she was in a dwelling house situated near the mill, after which she ran across the adjoining fields; when the second explosion ensued, she discovered a dark massy substance thrown into the air directly over her head; she had just time to escape from the spot where she stood to avoid the crash of the falling beam.

Five men have been by this tremendous accident hurried into eternity. The bodies of the sufferers were perfectly black, and mangled in so shocking a manner, that we will not inflict a pain in the heart of sensibility by dwelling on such affecting recitals. Three men were also dangerously wounded. So far as can be judged from recollection, there was about an interval of ten minutes from the first to the second explosion; the latter three followed in a more rapid succession. So entire was the destruction that the buildings are raised to the ground, and even the foundations blown up. Astonishing as it may appear, it is nevertheless true, that the roof of the magazine containing one hundred and fifty barrels of powder was blown off, and yet in the shower of descending sparks no further injury was done. We are credibly informed that this is the fifth time these mills have exploded in sixteen years, and that only one person has perished before the last distressing calamity.

To account for the difference of time between different explosions, it is only necessary to state, that the burning rafters and beams from the first building probably set fire to the second, and the other two being placed so near to each other, in all probability took fire more rapidly. The damages has been estimated to be about forty thousand dollars. One of the men was blown up by the explosion among the timbers, from whence he was suspended by the middle, and was distinctly heard calling to his companions for assistance when the second put a period to his sufferings. These are all the particulars of the awful calamity that have come to our knowledge.
