

## New-Brunswick Legislature

Extracts from the Journals of the House of Assembly.

THURSDAY, 20TH FEBRUARY.

Mr. P. Fraser presented a Petition of John Barker, praying for compensation for the injury he has sustained by the alteration made by the Supervisor, in carrying the Great Road of Communication from Fredericton to St. John, through his Land.

Ordered that the said Petition be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. P. Fraser presented a Petition of Joseph Merceraule, Sen. of Queensbury, in the County of York, praying that a Public Ferry about to be established at Alexander Burgoyne's, and to cross over to his premises, may not take place.

Ordered that the said Petition be received and lie on the Table.

Mr. Porter presented a Petition of the Rector, Wardens and Vestry of the Parish of St. Stephen, praying for aid to enable them to complete their Church, together with an account of expences incurred in building the said Church.

Ordered that the same be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Wetmore presented a Petition of sundry inhabitants of the Parish of Springfield, praying relief in their present distressed situation.

Ordered that the Petition be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Wetmore also presented a Petition of sundry inhabitants of Norton, King's County, respecting Schools.

Ordered that the Petition be received and lie on the table.

Mr. Wetmore presented a petition of the Wardens and Vestry of the Parish of Norton, in King's County, praying aid towards completing the Church in the said Parish. Also,

A Petition of Samuel Hallet and Samuel Fairweather, praying to be reimbursed in the sum of £10, being the sum they have expended over and above that which was granted for the purpose of building a Bridge over Studholme's Mill Stream.

Ordered that the said Petitions be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Wetmore presented a Petition of the inhabitants of the Parishes of Hampton and Norton, in King's County, praying for aid to enable them to improve a Public Road laid out by the Hon. Judge Upham, from his Farm on Hammond River, to Joseph Guthrie's on the Kennebec River.

A Petition of sundry Persons, inhabitants of the upper part of the Parish of Hampton, praying aid to enable them to improve the Road leading to Quaco, from the Finger-board near the Widow Smith's on Hammond River, to Tabor's.

Ordered that the said Petitions be received and referred to the Committee, for the purpose of ascertaining what sums are wanted for the Bye Roads and Bridges in the several Counties in this Province.

Mr. P. Fraser moved for leave to bring in "A Bill to provide for the erection of an Alms-House and Work-House within the County of York, and for the making of Rules and Regulations for the management of the same." Leave was granted.

Mr. Wilmot moved for leave to bring in "A Bill to encourage the Agriculture of the Province." Leave was granted.

Mr. P. Fraser moved for leave to bring in "A Bill for appointing Firewards, ascertaining their duty, and for punishing Thefts and disorders at the time of Fire." Leave was granted.

Ordered that Mr. Fraser and Mr. Campbell, be a committee to bring in "A Bill to continue the Laws now in force for raising a Revenue in this Province."

Mr. Allen presented a Petition of the inhabitants of the Nashwalksis settlement, praying for aid towards completing a Road from the River Saint John to the settlement, and for clearing the Nashwalksis Creek.

Ordered that the said Petition be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Simonds presented a Petition of sundry inhabitants of the Parish of Ludlow, County of Northumberland, praying aid to assist them in removing Rocks, &c. from the white, black and grey rapids, in the

south-west branch of the River Miramichi.

Ordered that the Petition be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

Mr. Scovil presented a Petition of sundry inhabitants of Queen's County, praying aid towards completing the Road leading from the River Saint John, near Richard Curry's, in Waterborough, across the tongue of intervalle to the thoroughfare leading from the Grand Lake to the Mequapit Lake.

Ordered that the Petition be received and referred to the Committee for the purpose of ascertaining what sums are wanted for the Bye-Roads and Bridges in the several Counties in this Province.

Mr. Millidge presented a Petition of the Mayor of St. John and others, praying for aid towards establishing a Seminary at St. John for the education of young Ladies, with other papers accompanying the same. Also,

A Petition of William Hutchinson, praying to be reimbursed the sum of £91 14 1 being the sum over and above the amount of his contract for building a Bridge over Little River in the County of Saint John, including articles stolen from him while performing the Contract.

Ordered that the same be received and referred to the Committee of Supply.

The House pursuant to the order of the day, went into consideration of the Petition of Henry Smith and Jedediah Slason, and of sundry Freeholders of the County of York and Electors of Representatives for the same County in General Assembly, complaining of an undue election for the same County.

Ordered that the House do now go into Committee on consideration of the said Petitions.

Mr. Peters took the Chair of the Committee.

Mr. Peters from the Committee reported that they had gone into consideration of the business to them referred, and that he was directed by the Committee to report that they had come to the following Resolution:—

Resolved that it is the opinion of this Committee that the House do go into the hearing of the parties upon the said Petitions with all convenient dispatch. Which report the House agreed to.

Mr. Peters moved for leave to bring in "A Bill to empower the Firewards in the City of Saint John to pull down Houses for the purpose of preventing the spreading of Fires in the said City, and to provide for making compensation to the owners of such Houses." Also

A Bill in further addition to an Act, intitled, "An Act for the better extinguishing fires that may happen within the City of Saint John." Leave was granted.

On motion ordered, that Henry Smith and Jedediah Slason, do furnish George D. Berton, late Sheriff of the County of York, with a Copy of their Petition, and also of the Petition of sundry Freeholders of the said County; and Electors of Representatives for the same County, in General Assembly, complaining of an undue Election for the same County: And another copy of each of the said Petitions to the sitting Members of the County.

And further ordered, that the Petitioners be heard by their Counsel, at the bar of this House, on Monday the third day of March next, and that Ezekiel Sloor, Samuel Grosvenor, William Jackson, Garret Clopper, Esquire, Thomas Phillips, David Phillips, William C. Williams, Henry Cronkite, junior, John Howard, George Hilman, do then attend at the bar of this House to give evidence of what they and each of them know as to matters depending on the said Petitions.

On motion, ordered that the order of the day for going into committee on "A Bill to amend and explain an Act, intitled, an Act to encourage the Fisheries of this Province," be discharged and that the House will go into Committee on the said Bill tomorrow.

Read an engrossed Bill "For preventing the destruction of Fish in the Fishery on the Coast of Grand Manan."

Ordered thereupon, that the Bill do pass, and that Mr. Mackay and Mr. Millidge do carry the same to the Council and desire their concurrence.
