On Monday evening at two Soldiers of the 100th regt. were boxing in the Barrack yard, one of them received a blow, which brought him to the ground, where he immediately expired;—an Inquest was held on the body, and a verdict returned of chance meddling.

Last Friday as part of the above regiment was proceeding down the river in bateaux, one of the men accidentally fell overboard and was drowned; the body has since been found and interred.

Drowned on Saturday last Master JOHN KING, youngest son of the late John King of this place, in the 12th year of his age—his remains were interred on Sunday afternoon.

DIED] On Sunday evening last, on board the ship Perseus, CHRISTOPHER DAVIDSON; (Seaman,) a native of Northumberland, (Eng.) His death was in consequence of a fall from the main deck, on Friday preceding, backwards into the hold, striking the ballast board with great violence.

—On examination of the case by Dr. W. H. SMITH, it appeared the whole force of the fall was received so as to produce a luxation of the fifth and sixth vertebrae of the back, causing a violent contusion; if not a total separation of the medulla spinalis, from which a privation of sensation and muscular motion immediately succeeded; and in this state, without the least prospect of recovery, the unfortunate man languished until the time above mentioned, when he expired.

Welburn, went ashore on Briar Island in a very thick fog—the ship will be a total wreck; chief part of the materials saved—The Trafalgar was from Hull bound to this port, and from hence to Quebec, and had 159 passengers, which together with the crew were all saved.
