Hoops, or Squared Timber of any sort ; Horses, Neat Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or Live Stock of any sort ; Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Peas, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley or Grain of any sort; and British Subjects during the same period, are hereby authorized and empowered to export in British ships owned and navigated as aforesaid, all or any of the said herein before enumerated articles, to any other of His Majesty's Colonies or Plantations.
