whole covered with carved images of ridieulous forms. At the entrance of the front door, on the pillars which support the veranda, is an inscription in Gentoo characters, which the Bramins themselves pretend they cannot read. On our arrival the doors were close. A number of Bramins who were within, feasting on the offering, made a great noise ; but one of them told us it was their god who was eating. We conversed with the people without, who expressed their superstitious attachment to the place and its worship. Towards noon the doors were opened, and a crowd of people came out. This gave us an opportunity of conversing with some of the principal Bramins, on the difference between their gods (whom we said might easily be destroyed by men) and our Goo, who made the heavens and the earth. We asked one, who appeared to be more intelligent and zealous than the rest, if he had ever committed sin. He answered, no. We then asked him where he would go after death. He replied, 'To the same place where you will go.' One of the brethren said, " if I am wicked, I shall go to hell, and so will you." He replied ' There is no hell.' One observed to him, "Your gods have no power to do good or evil. No one therefore, ought to fear or worship them; and that the true God would punish them if they persisted in their idolatry." He was asked whether the Bramins ever commit any bad actions, --- whether they ever tell a lie, or attempt to de-
