**Enforcement of the Navigation Act.**

A letter received by the Collector of this port, by Tuesday's mail, from the Comptroller of the Treasury, dated the 18th inst. declares in substance, that all British vessels now in this port, bound to British ports from which American vessels are excluded (as specified in the second section of the Navigation Act.) must not only clear out at the Custom-House, but must actually depart from the port on the 30th of the present month. The law is to be regarded as going into operation the 1st of October next, and all British vessels, bound as aforesaid, which shall be found within the limits of the port on that day, will be liable to the penalty of the law. The act of sailing must be considered as shewing the intention of the party to proceed to a foreign port. The effect of any subsequent acts and circumstances (such, it is presumed, as head winds, boisterous weather, &c.) cannot with propriety be determined, until cases of the kind shall actually occur, and a full development of those acts and circumstances shall be made to the Treasury Department.

SUCH Persons as may be desirous of Baking Bread, of Government Flour, for the use of His Majesty's Troops in this Garrison, from 25th November next to 24th June, 1819; will send sealed proposals to this Office, on or before 12 o'clock on Tuesday the 17th November, indorsed "Tender for Baking."

The Flour must be taken from the King's Stores and the Bread delivered to the Regiments at their Barracks, or at the Commissariat Stores, at the expense of the Contractor, and to the Staff and Departments at the Bakery, if within the Garrison.

The first issue will be on Thursday the 26th November, and to be continued three times a-week to the Regiments, in Loaves of 4lbs. each, and every second day to the Staff and Departments, in Loaves of 2lb. each. The Manufactory of the Baker and his depot for Flour, to be at all times open to the inspection of such person as may be appointed by the Officer in charge of the Commissariat.

The Casks in which the Flour is contained, are as an equivalent for Truckage.

Unexceptionable security will be required for the performance of the Contract, a form of which may be seen at this Office any day between the hours of 10 and 2.
