**PIRATES.**—We learn that the two Insurance Companies of this place have sustained a loss of more than 40 000 dollars, in consequence of the robbery of seventy-two slaves out of a vessel from the Chesapeake by a piratical sloop off the Berry Islands. This is a solitary example of the injury inflicted on the commerce of New-Orleans by the numerous pirates that swarm in the Gulf of Mexico, the West India seas, and along the Atlantic shore of Florida. It has lately been ascertained that there is a band at Galveztown, which exists by piracy and smuggling. One of their cruizers, commanded by Lamaison, was brought into the river a few days since by the Firebrand; at the same time, an open boat, with the noted Peter Lanitte on board, was brought in by sailing-master Quin, in a boat of the ketch Surprise. It has been reported that the banditti, who robbed the slaves above mentioned, have been caught and carried into Havana; if this report be true, we are exceedingly glad of it. But we are inclined to receive it with distrust; we suspect that it has been put in circulation for the purpose of lulling the vigilance of the officers who have been sent in pursuit of them by Commodore Patterson.
