THEREAS by an Act passed in the present Session of Parliament, intituled " An Act to allow for three years, " and until six months after the commence w ment of the then next Session of Parlia-" ment, the Importation into Ports specially st appointed by His Majesty, within the Provinces of Nova-Scotta and New-" Brunswick, of the articles therein enumerated, and the Re-exportation thereof " from such Ports," it is enacted, That it shall and may be lawful in any British built ship or vessel, owned and navigated according to law, or in any ship or vessel belonging to the Subjects of any Sovereign or State in amity with His Majesty, to import into and export from such Ports within the Province of Nova-Scotia or New-Brunswick as shall be specially appointed for that purpose, certain articles in the said Act enumerated, any thing in any law to the contrary notwithstanding: His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, by virtue of the powers vested in His Majesty by the above recised Act, is pleased, in the name and on the behalf of His Majesty, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, That from and after the date of this Order, and during the continuance of the Act above recited, until further order made thereon, Port of Saint John, in New-Brunswick, any Scantling, Planks, Staves, Heading-Boards, Shingles, Hoops, Horses, Near Cattle, Sheep, Hogs, Poultry, or live Stock of any sort, Bread, Biscuit, Flour, Pease, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barpentine, Fruits, Seeds, and Tobacco : Oats, Barley, or Gram of any sort wire the same shall be imported in Foreign vessels, be of the growth, produce, or manufacture of the Country to which the vessels importing the same shall belong; And that n shall be lawful, in any British built ship or vessel, owned and navigated according to law, to export from the said Ports, any of the said arricles, either to the United Kingdoes, or to any other of His Majesty's pos-\$2301031\$

> FREE PORT ACT. [MAY 8, 1818.]

Reign, intituled, " An Act for permitting from thence to the end of the next Session enumerated Articles into the British Colonies on the Continent of North America, from the United States of America, and the exportation of other enumerated Articles from the same Colonies to the said States;" which said Act was continued and extended by an Act, passed in the 49th year of His Majesty's Keign, intituled, "An Act to authorise His Majesty to permit, until the 25th day of March, 1812, any Goods and Commodities to be imported into and exported from Nova-Scotia and New-Brunswick, in any ship or vessel whatsoever," which last mentioned Act was continued by an Act, passed in the 52d year of His Majesty's reign, sundry Articles were allowed to be imported into and exported from, certain Ports in His Majesty's Colonies of Nova-Scotia and New-Brunswick, from and to certain foreign ports, which Acts have now expired :-- And whereas, great advantage resulted to the said Colonies, from the facilities given to the Trade therefore by the aid Acts; And whereas, it is expedient to grant similar facilities at the present time; -Be it therefore Enacted, by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the President of the United States of America. advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same, That, from and after the passing of this Act, it shall and may be lawit shall be lawful in any British built ship ful in any BRITISH built ship or vessels, of vestel, owr and navigated according to owned and navigated according to law, or law, or in any ship or vessel belonging to in any ship or vessel belonging to the Sub-Nova-Scotin or New-Brunswick, the fullowing Articles, viz.
