It has been represented to His Excellency the EARL OF DALHOUSIE, by the Right Hon'ble the Postmaster General, that THOMAS PINNOCK, who is strongly suspected of being principally engaged in great depredations upon the property of the Public passing through the General Post Office, and for whose apprehension and conviction a Reward of £150 has been offered, embarked under the assumed name of FRIENDLY, at the Port of Belfast, on the 17th May last, in the Ship Jessy, of Ayr, Captain Lyons, for St. Andrews, New Brunswick.

With the object of bringing this offender (who is supposed to be either in this Province, or in one of the neighbouring Colonies) to public justice, I am commanded by His Excellency to publish the following Notice, issued in London, by Command of the Post-Master General.

**£150 REWARD.**

THOMAS PINNOCK, late of St. Ann's Court, Soho, is strongly suspected of Felony: Whoever shall apprehend him, will be entitled to a Reward of One Hundred and Fifty Pounds.

£50 part thereof, upon apprehension, and £100 payable upon conviction.

The said THOMAS PINNOCK is about 40 years of age, stout made, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, dark complexion, black hair and whiskers, and fresh coloured; was dressed on the 15th instant in a new snuff coloured brown coat, covered silk buttons, double breasted buff waistcoat, with buttons of the same; has worn at times a yellow-green lapelled coat, a blue coat with gilt buttons, and a dark brown great coat. He has been a gentleman's servant, is supposed to have been in the army, and has been abroad. His wife is probably with him.

**SAINT JOHN, OCTOBER 31.**

The ship Henry, Captain John Hepburn, of London, after being detained by head winds and unfavorable weather, for ten days, sailed from this Port for the Island of Jamaica, on last Thursday night, about half past eleven o'clock, with a fair wind, favorable weather and every thing promising. In passing to the Eastward of Pertridge Island, the Pilot must have been deceived by the Star light, and thought the ship a greater distance from the shore: she was about ten feet too near, and unfortunately struck on the easternmost reef of rocks off the Island—her top-gallant sails were promptly loosed, set, and every exertion used to get the ship off, in vain. She suddenly fell off, to the great risk of her upsetting, when the lives of the crew would have been in imminent danger—providentially her masts and yards prevented this, and the ship was kept on her beam ends, with her yards and topmasts in the water, and her keel several feet out. On the flowing of the tide her masts were cut away, and the ship disincumbered as much as practicable—she gradually righted, floated, and is now at anchor, full of water, to the southward of the reef of rocks, with her wrecked materials secured as far as possible; and with the assistance of the Steam-Boat and favourable weather, there is every prospect of her being got into the harbour by high water this day. What damage the ship may have sustained cannot yet be ascertained, but it is hoped that she can be repaired.

Captain HEBBURN, and Messrs. PAGAN & Co. feel grateful to Captain WALKER, of the ship *Nauticus*, of London, for his prompt attention in volunteering the service of his boat, masts and crew, to the assistance of the ship—also to Captain HUME, of the ship *Favourite*, of Grosbeck, and to Captain GARRISON, of the brig *Jane*, of this port, for their friendly attention, as well as to many of the inhabitants of the city who also volunteered their services and gave every possible assistance.

We are happy to say that the Steam Boat has brought the ship *Henry* to anchor in this harbour.
