**LORD COCHRANE.**

It appears from letters received at Phila-  
 delphia, that Lord Cochrane had been in-  
 vited to, and accepted, from the Indepen-  
 dent States of South America, the command  
 of their squadron in the Pacific Ocean.  
 The report, however, of his arrival in South  
 America, cannot be true; though it was  
 expected he would eventually engage his  
 active service in the revolutionary strug-  
 gle.

By the treaty lately concluded by Great-  
 Britain and Spain, the former pays the sum  
 of £400,000 sterling, as a full compensa-  
 tion for any losses consequent upon the abo-  
 lition of the Slave Trade.

On this subject the Globe observes,—  
 "By this act, the English Government has  
 virtually taken part with Ferdinand against  
 the Patriots of South America, and by this  
 purchase granted him a subsidy of £400,000  
 to enable him to reduce them to subjec-  
 tion."

A million sterling has been offered to  
 France for a similar purpose.

By a decree of the 2d of last month, the  
 king of Naples has conferred on Prince  
 Talleyrand, the title of Duke of Dina, with  
 the right of transmitting it at his demise,  
 to his nephew count Edmond Perigord.

The monument from the masterly chisel  
 of Westmacott, which is to be erected in  
 Westminster Abbey, to the memory of the  
 late Right Honourable Charles James Fox,  
 is nearly completed. It consists of two  
 beautiful female figures lamenting over the  
 departed Statesman, and a negro slave sit-  
 ting on the steps of the pedestal, with his  
 eyes raised in gratitude to Mr. Fox, for the  
 distinguished part he took in the abolition of  
 the disgraceful Slave Trade.—We are glad  
 that a circumstance, unconnected with poli-  
 tics, and in the admiration of which all clas-  
 ses and ages must join, has been chosen from  
 the history of Mr. Fox's life to be his memo-  
 rial with posterity.

The following paragraph, taken from  
 Prince Leopold's answer to the Berkshire  
 Address of Condolence, contains a clear ex-  
 pression of his Serene Highness's purpose to  
 make England his country of permanent  
 residence: "On no occasion has the gen-  
 eral sympathy and feeling for his misfor-  
 tunes been more affectionately manifested

than in the condolence he has now to ac-  
 knowledge: he is anxious to record it with  
 those innumerable and unquestionable proofs  
 of generous affection, and of deep sorrow,  
 with which the country have cheered and  
 supported him, under its own awful and  
 afflicting sufferings; to meet their assurances  
 with his own, that his first thoughts, and  
 prayers, his most fervent and unceasing  
 wishes, will ever be for their welfare and  
 prosperity; and to acknowledge in his pride,  
 as it is his first remaining happiness, that his  
 destiny is forever united to the British  
 nation."
