Hoops, or Squared Timber of any sort ; Horses, Near Cattle, Sheep, Hoga, Paultry, or Live Stock of any sort; Bread, Bismit, Floor, Peas, Beans, Potatoes, Wheat, Rice, Oats, Barley or Grain of any sort; and British Subjects during the same period, are hereby authorized and empowered to export in British ships owned and mavigar ted as atoregaid, all or any of the said herein before enumerated articles to any other of His Majesty's Golonies or Piantations
