**LONDON, JULY 7.**

**THE KING'S HEALTH.**—The following is the  
 public bulletin exhibited at St. James's Palace, on  
 Sunday:—

“ Windsor Castle, July 4.

“ His Majesty has been very tranquil through-  
 out the last month, and continues to enjoy good bodily  
 health; but his Majesty's disorder is undiminished.”

Saturday night's Gazette notifies the appointment  
 of John Bernard Gilpin, Esq. as Consul for the  
 State of Rhode Island; and the Prince Regent's  
 permission to the 5th Regiment of Foot to bear on  
 their colours and appointments, the words “Badajoz,  
 Orthos, and Toulouse;” the 47th, the words  
 “ Vittoria and St. Sebastian;” the 14th, 69th,  
 60th, 78th, and 89th, the word “ Java;” and the  
 19th Lancers, 22d (late 25th) Light Dragoons,  
 12th, 33d, 73d, 74th, 75th, 77th, and 94th Foot,  
 the word “ Seringapatam.”—It also contains a  
 notification from the Lords of the Treasury, that  
 henceforth foreign linseed and foreign hams (not  
 imported by the East India Company) will be per-  
 mitted to be warehoused under the 43d of the  
 King.

**LONDON, JULY 18.**

Nine British Regiments will be withdrawn from  
 France to the Netherlands.

**BOSTON, August 21.**

The following articles are from the Gib-  
 raltar paper of June 20, received yesterday  
 at Merchants Hall:

**ALGIERS, APRIL 14.**—On the 12th  
 inst, an Anglo-American squadron, consist-  
 ing of two line of battle ships, 1 frigate, and  
 2 sloops, came to anchor in this Bay for the  
 purpose of reminding this government, that  
 in case their privateers should go out, they  
 are not to search any American vessels, or  
 to reconnoitre them in any other way than  
 by their flag, which secures the commerce  
 of their nation; and that the U. S. Govern-  
 ment will look upon any contravention as an  
 act of hostility, and will make themselves  
 satisfaction accordingly. On the next day  
 the squadron sailed for Leghorn without  
 communicating with the shore.

**NEW-YORK, AUGUST 12.**

The Catskill Recorder states, that the  
 gospel of St. Mark has been translated into  
 the Mohawk language by the late celebra-  
 ted Indian chief Brandt; and the gospel of  
 John by Capt. Norton, of Upper Canada;  
 and the American Bible Society have or-  
 dered an edition of 1000 copies of each  
 to be published and distributed among the  
 six nations.

**PARIS, JULY 6.**

The clouds that cover the conspiracy,  
 which has for this week past been the sub-  
 ject of general conversation, begin to clear  
 up. It appears to have been serious and  
 daring in the plan, but weak and absurd as to  
 the means of execution. Among the per-  
 sons judicially arrested, are Vendean Mare-  
 chal de Camp Chapeleiras, M. de Romilly,  
 chief of the Staff to General Canuel, when  
 at Lyons; and M. de Songes, Aide-de-  
 Camp to the same General, who, it is said,  
 has fled.

It appears that M. de Chateaubriand con-  
 tinues to talk loudly of his, to say the least  
 of it, indiscreet attack. If I am rightly in-  
 formed, that noble Peer has written to Mr.  
 Canning, on whose intervention and sup-  
 port he flatters himself he has a right to rely.  
 In this opinion, I cannot concur: a States-  
 man so distinguished and judicious as Mr.  
 Canning certainly will not implicate himself  
 in this affair.

The negotiations between Spain and  
 Portugal have again assumed a turn which is  
 far from favourable.—The Cabinet of Ma-  
 drid consent to submit to the mediation of  
 the five Allied Courts, but on such condi-  
 tions that Count Palmella, it is said, has de-  
 clared them to be inadmissible. As in this  
 state of things the negotiations must necessa-  
 rily be protracted, it is thought that the  
 Duke of Wellington will soon return to  
 Cambray.
