

LONDON, MAY 29.
Thursday next is the day said to be fixed on for the dissolution of Parliament, provided nothing should interfere to alter the arrangements.

His Grace the Duke of Richmond gives a sumptuous entertainment this day to the Officers of the 35th Regiment, now at Brighton, on account of his speedy departure for the Canadas.

It is said that six Regiments of the line will shortly be embarked for the East Indies, and that Sir Miles Power and Major General Sir John Keppel will go out at the same time to augment the Staff there.

Her Majesty is stated to have been gradually recovering from her late indisposition.

The Prince Regent has appointed Sir Charles Hamilton, Bart. Vice Admiral of the Blue, Governor of Newfoundland.

His Grace the Duke of Wellington is expected to arrive here this evening, or to-morrow.

CAPTURE OF PENSACOLA.
New-York, June 26.

We have at length something like an authentic account of the capture of Pensacola by General Jackson. The Town surrendered to the Am troops under the command of General Jackson, on the 24th May, and the fort at the Baranca on the 27th with the loss of 19 men. The Americans lost but two.

The British schooner *Perseverance*, from St. John, was seized on Saturday by the Revenue Cutter, for a violation of the law in landing passengers at Sandy Hook and at Amboy, then proceeding again to sea, without coming to a regular entry at the Custom-House.
