London, September 5.

A most horrid crime was committed at Toulouse on the 14th instant, by a young female, who assassinated her own brother. Madame Mazas had become guarantee for her brother for the sum of 1300 francs. Before the note was due, her husband went to Moissac to receive the amount, according to his engagement; but his brother-in-law gave him a very evasive and unsatisfactory answer, saying he would see him at Toulouse. Mazzs, on his return, informed his wife of the manner in which he had been received, and the latter, indignant at such conduct, only thought of being revenged. On the arrival of her brother, she purchased a large knife; she then went to him, and after loading him with the most violent reproaches, plunged the knife into his heart. The unfortunate victim fell at her feet, and instantly expired. The assassin left the house without any emotion, and went to her own residence to change her dress. She was immediztely taken into custody, and on being interrogated by the Juge d'Instruction, she ealmly replied, that if she had shed the blood of her brother, she had strong motives for so doing, and that the want of sincerity on the part of the victim had infuriated her mind, which led her to the commission of the deed.

A machine has recently been invented to drag the river Tiber, from the bridge Molle as far as San Paolo, to recover the precious objects which it is generally supposed are buried in its bed. Many people are persuaded that the golden candlesticks of Jerusalem will be found; however, should the project of finding these objects (which, perhaps have not been thrown into the river,) fail, great hopes are entertained of obtaining some valuable antiquities, although in a bad state. The design cannot be carried into effect this year, on account of the increase of waters, which takes place annually in automn.

An Upper Canada Paper of the 3d instant mentions that other Townships as well as Kingston and Ernest Town, were going to petition the Lieutenant Governor and disclaim the imputation of sedition.—There is not the least doubt of the inhabitants of the upper province being good and loyal subjects; but the shortest way to convice Sir Peregrine and every other, that they are so, would be to cease being the disciples of Mr. Gourlay, and forbear urging the necessity of a Convention of Delegates, which is not only unconstitutional, but even incompatible with a House of Representatives.

The exceptionable clause in the Lieutenant Governor's speech, wherein mention is made of exciting discontent and organizing sedition, on an attentive reading, clearly appears to refer to Mr. Gourlay, and not strictly to the people of Upper Canada. Both Houses of Parliament seem by their Addresses to have understood it in the former sense, and it is not a little surprising that it could have been construed differently.

Mr. Gourlay, it is true, has been twice tried and twice acquitted of what was laid to his charge; but doubts, it seems, still continue of the uprightness of his intentions; and the Lieutenani Governor ought not to be blaned for keeping a very watchful eye over such an assuming and such a violent character.
