

Our readers could not fail to be highly gratified in observing that the Courier of yesterday, in replying to some anti-ministerial accusations of the Morning Chronicle, intimates in a manner sufficiently plain, though with visible reluctance, that the interference of the Allied Sovereigns in the affairs of South America is not meant to be supported by force of arms. Spain is to offer favourable terms of reconciliation to the revolted States, and the great powers of Europe are to guarantee that these terms shall be faithfully executed. As far as this goes, their mediation will be perfectly harmless, as we may be quite sure that any treaty which proposes the return of the South American States to the dominion of Spain will be as ineffectual as the proclamations for the suppression of vice. The Courier, however, insinuates that if entreaties should fail, compulsion ought then to be employed. Such a crusade would be as destructive to those who engaged in it, as that which was formerly undertaken against infidels for the deliverance of the holy land, and would probably terminate in the same manner.

From the Halifax Journal, received this morning per mail, we have copied the following late European intelligence:—  
London, September 22.

The **Bon Accord**, arrived at Aberdeen on the 17th instant, from Davis Straits, with about 200 tons of oil. She left the ice only 12 days before, and has brought dispatches for the Admiralty from the Discovery Ships, which she fell in with a short time previous to her departure.  
September 24:

Private accounts, on which we can confidently rely, state, that the amiable Consort of our venerable Sovereign is not in so very alarming a condition as reported in some of the Newspapers, but that her state is certainly precarious.

The following is the Bulletin which was issued this day:—

"New Palace, Sept. 24.  
"The Queen has had a good night—

there is no material alteration in the symptoms of her Majesty's complaint."

The British Troops in France were to be reviewed on the 20th October, and it is supposed will quit that Country immediately afterwards.

Scarcely any variation has taken place in the Funds since Saturday last. Consols commenced this morning at 74½.

The Morning Herald of Tuesday says, "Her Majesty's debility increases. We understand she is now so much reduced as to be unable to recognise the Members of the Royal Family without great exertion and explanation."

Spain, it is said, has settled her differences with the Court of Brazil.

Mr. O'Meara, the Surgeon, who attended Bonaparte at St. Helena, is arrived in town, and has had several long interviews with Ministers.

Our accounts from Manchester this morning represent Lancashire to be at present in a quiet state.

Aix-la-Chapelle, Sept. 15.

Lord Castlereagh is at present at Spa, where it is thought he will remain some days previous to proceeding hither.

September 18.

It is now known with certainty that the King of Prussia will arrive here on the 24th instant. The Emperor of Austria will make his entry on the 25th, and the Emperor of Russia on the 27th. The entries will be attended with the greatest splendor.  
Hamburg, September 11.

Provisions are here very dear, in consequence of an enormous exportation of them to England.

### NEWFOUNDLAND, NOV. 3.

Between ten and eleven o'clock on Sunday night last, a fire broke out in a house occupied by **JOHN WALSH**, in the rear of the Meeting House, which we are happy to state, by a timely alarm being given, was got under without doing any material damage. It appears, upon inquiry, that this house has been unoccupied all the summer until last Friday, when it was taken by the present tenant, and on kindling a fire, it is supposed some sparks got through the hearth, (which was quite loose and unsafe, from having been undermined by the rats,) communicated with the beams underneath, and finally made its way to the outside of the building, and when first discovered the whole end of the house, to the roof, was in a blaze. Most of the neighbors were in bed, and we have great reason to apprehend had it happened an hour later, all the buildings in that quarter would have been laid waste in a very short time.
