

function. We have made an immense profit by encouraging the importation of ship-timber from Canada, &c. to the partial exclusion of foreigners from that trade. Why not make a similar essay in the trade of lumber and other articles? One argument, which appears a strong one upon this question, is, that so long as the United States afford the regular and understood channels through which we draw the means of existence to our colonies, the higher politics of England in all matters of discussion with that Republic, must be considerably influenced and embarrassed by apprehensions for the colonies, should those discussions end in war. Prepare for that event in time—give the Northern Colonies the same preference in supplying the West Indies, as Ireland enjoys, under Sir John Newport's Bill, over the Baltic States, in furnishing this country with corn. We regret the spirit in which this measure seems to have been adopted by the American Congress; but we do not anticipate any serious mischief from its operation.

7TH JULY, 1818.
