

At 11 o'clock a ship lately arrived in the river, in great distress, several ships having lost their top-masts, &c. It was apprehended, that these vessels would be obliged to put into some port on the Coast, before they could succeed in reaching their destination. In the mean time the Ceylon Papers inform us, that they are looking out for the arrival of the fleet with great anxiety; the state of affairs being such as to afford little prospect of a speedy termination to the insurrection, without the aid of more troops than are at present on the island. We are however, much in the dark as to the real state of matters, which it is conjectured by many, who have information from private letters, are worse than represented in the public Papers.

WASHINGTON, JAN. 22.

A gentleman, now in our city, has recently engaged with a few associates, in exploring the Cobalt mines, in Chatham County, Connecticut. The results, according to present signs and appearances, are so highly flattering as to give the proprietors every reason to expect that a sufficient quantity of this valuable mineral can be taken from the mine annually, as would supply the porcelain and linen manufactories of Great Britain and Ireland, on much more reasonable terms than they are now furnished by Sweden and Germany. The Chinese, who now receive annually a highly valued oxide of Cobalt ore, called Azure, from the Crown mines of Poland, for their China ware manufactories, can be supplied from this country more directly, and on more reasonable terms; this will, in some degree, serve as a substitute for specie, in our trade with that country. This gentleman is pursuing his valuable and useful researches into the mineral resources of this country, and will propose to Congress, this session, to explore the copper mines of Lake Superior, with which he is somewhat acquainted, thereby ascertaining if that highly useful and necessary metal, in the arts of commerce, can be obtained within the bosom of our own territories; if so, it will relieve us from foreign dependence in this respect.

BOSTON, JAN. 20.

Capt. Allen, of the brig Joseph, from Isle of May, reports as follows:—On the 30th Nov. a large ship of 22 guns, under English colour, came into the harbour and anchored. About sunset she boarded the Joseph, with pistols, muskets, swords, &c. drove the captain and all hands down the fore-castle, and placed a guard over them; then went into the cabin, plundered the captain of considerable cash, and all his, and the mate's best clothing, &c. and then departed, taking all the brig's boats, with them, to prevent communication with the shore. She then served all the other American vessels in port, viz. (Charles, Cadmus, and Boston) in the same manner, taking all their boats, &c. While on board the Joseph, the captain and two men of the Cadmus came on board, and were driven down forward; and just before leaving, one of the men fired a pistol down the fore-castle, and killed a young man by the name of Clark, of the schr. Cadmus.—The banditti then went ashore, and proceeded to plunder the inhabitants, who fled to the mountains. They compelled the mate of the Cadmus to march in front, and while running shot him in the leg. After plundering to their satisfaction, they returned on board boasting of having obtained 18 000 dollars. On the 1st December, she fired, hoisted the Artigas' flag, and stood out to sea.

They also robbed the brig Charles, of New York, and the Boston of Alexandria. One of the men informed that they had been out from Baltimore about four months, and that they had put their officers out; but they had more probably murdered them.

MONTREAL, DEC. 30.

From the Acts passed in the last Session of the Parliament of Upper Canada, is selected for this day's paper, the Act, on account of its importance and the opposition it met with out of doors, which renders unlawful the convention or assembling of Delegates.

The firmness of the Lieut. Governor in refusing to receive the Address of the Delegates, the happy unanimity which prevail in every branch of the Legislature, and their activity in dispatching the public business, have now restored tranquillity to that Province, and dispelled the discontent which was brooding over it. The troubles and confusion in which Mr. Gourlay has for some time past, been endeavouring to involve Upper Canada, are now, it is said, receding upon himself; however as some good is generally derived from evil, the ferment occasioned about this extraordinary man, will, at least for some time to come, make those in office more circumspect in discharging that duty, which in their respective stations they owe to the public.
